3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Waiter 4 makes preparations for the servicing process by setting out the necessary tableware for serving. During the servicing process the waiter welcomes customers, presents products and services, advises customers and takes orders. Waiter prepares beverages and serves food and drinks, communicates with customers in a friendly manner and in accordance with good practice. At the end of the servicing process the waiter clears accounts with the customers, asks for feedback and sees the customers out while maintaining a positive customer contact.

A waiter is responsible for the functioning of the servicing process, works in a team and supervises assistant waiters. The waiter has a good knowledge of the enterprise's products and services.

Work of level 4 waiters includes:

- Planning and organization of work
- Starting the servicing situation
- Taking and forwarding orders
- Preparing beverages
- Serving food and drinks
- Ending the service situation
- Catering and serving at parties
- Clearing away and cleaning work

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (1)

A waiter is a customer service employee who works at an enterprise providing catering services (restaurant, cafeteria, pub, night club, club, etc.)
